Roger Martin

Professor of Flute, Tennessee Tech. University, Cookeville

A member of the music faculty at Tennessee Technological University since 1989, Roger Martin attended Virginia Commonwealth University, and Florida State University where he earned his B.M., M.M. and D.M. in Flute and Woodwind Performance. Over the past eighteen years he has played with Cookeville, Tennessee's Bryan Symphony Orchestra, the Fargo-Moorhead Symphony, the Nashville Chamber Orchestra, the Nashville Symphony, and the Festival Chamber Orchestra of the Breckenridge Music Festival in Colorado.



Shelly Binder

Associate Professor of Music University of Tenn. Knoxville

Dr. Binder attended North Carolina School for the Arts; the Cincinnati Conservatory; Virginia Commonwealth; and Florida State University, where she earned her D.M. She has played with the Virginia Symphony, Virginia Opera and Central Wisconsin Symphony Orchestra. She has appeared as a recitalist and clinician throughout the United States. She is a student of Louis Moyse, and recently finished writing his biography.

U.S. Air Force Band and former Graduate Teaching Assistant UTK

Currently performing with the Ocmulgee Symphony Orchestra, and the Band of the U.S. Air Force Reserve, Sarah Carter received her bachelor's degree in flute performance from Shenandoah University in 2001 and her Master's degree in flute performance from the University of Tennessee, Knoxville in 2004. She has performed with the Tidewater Winds, the Hampton Roads Wind Symphony, the International Fame Festival Repertory Orchestra, the American Wind Symphony Orchestra, the Pierre Monteaux School Orchestra, and the Oak Ridge Symphony Orchestra.

What is the Dogwood Flute Festival?

It is a 1 day non-profit workshop and concert for all interested flute players who are playing at a strong intermediate level or above. It is hosted by Grace Notes Flute Choir Inc. of Maryville, Tennessee. The choir hosted a similar workshop in 2004 in Maryville with over 30 flutists in attendance. The response to the event was overwhelmingly positive and all agreed we should do it again in the future.

Festival musicians will start the day sight reading in 2 different sessions, attend a masterclass, enjoy a catered light dinner and later perform with the flute orchestra in a free concert for the public at 7:00pm. The concert will also feature solos by our guest artists and 2 additional flute ensembles: Trillium Flute Ensemble and the UTK Flute Choir.

The orchestra will feature a range of instruments including the C flute, piccolo, alto, bass and contra bass flute. The orchestra will be under the shared direction of Shelley Binder from the University of Tennessee, Knoxville, and Roger Martin of Tennessee Technological University, Cookeville.

Parking

Directions from Knoxville

Saint Andrew's is located in downtown Maryville. If you are travelling south from Knoxville on Alcoa Highway (U.S. 129), bear left at the highway split after you pass McGhee-Tyson Airport. Follow this street past Kroger's. At the foot of the Washington Street bridge turn right on Broadway. Go through two red lights and you'll see St. Andrew's on your left just past McCammon-Ammons Funeral Home.
